I had the privilege of growing up in a beautiful Victorian-era home (built in 1880s) in my hometown of Lebanon, IL. While most every room in the house was utilized daily by my older sister and me, there was one area of the home us kids really had no use for: the dining room. Featuring a striking dining table, carefully displayed family keepsakes and tasteful blue wallpaper, it was largely considered a special occasions room to be admired rather than a location for regular foot-traffic. So my sister and I would pass it daily...but would rarely enter.

I bring up my beloved childhood home because it closely resembles how people of faith often approach the Bible. Sure, we have our popular go-to passages found in the Psalms or in the book of Romans or basically anywhere in the Gospel writings. But then...there's Hezekiah. Or sweet little Nahum. Books such as these are like the "dining rooms" of scripture. We know they're there. We appreciate they're there. But we don't commonly utilize these books or spend much time just sitting with them and their messages.

A few months back, I asked around to investigate what kinds of sermons or sermon series you would be most interested focusing on in the future. Fantastic feedback came my way including a sermon series on books or people of the Bible who are often overlooked and worth examining.

I loved this idea.

Ergo, for the next few weeks this summer, we'll be diving into parts of our beloved Bible that are either unfamiliar or understudied by many of us.

Starting with the book of Joel, heading over to the book of Habakkuk, and then researching a few more topics and books within our Bible, I pray we all gain a clearer, more accurate understanding of God as we explore some of the most stirring and powerful images of God's character.

Without reading God's story in its entirety, people of faith miss out on an even greater picture of God's love and grace. By reading about the "little guys" in scripture, we're also affirming to ourselves and to our children that ALL of the Bible is approachable, timely, and plain ol' important.

God is always on the move and God is always talking...even when it comes to the "less popular" crowd in scripture. I can't wait to share even more about who God is with you this summer!



As we enter into July and prepare to celebrate the birthday of our nation, I like to look at some of the more patriotic hymns in our hymnal. The song we are going to study this month is the "Battle Hymn of the Republic". There was an old folk song that troops back during the Civil War used to sing as they went off to war. It was called "John Brown's Body". This was a song about a man who had been hanged in his efforts to free the slaves. There was a young woman named Julia Ward Howe who heard these soldiers singing this many times. She really liked the catchy tune but felt the words were terrible. In an effort to express her feelings of the dreadful events of the time, she started writing new verses to the old tune, almost without looking at the paper. This "new" song became a national hymn and first appeared in the Atlantic Monthly Magazine in 1862. It was a battle song for the Republic. Before long, the entire nation became inspired by her words and united in singing this hymn. It has been acclaimed through the years as one of the finest patriotic songs. Once it was sung as a solo at a large rally attended by President Abraham Lincoln. After the audience responded with a loud applause, the President, with tears in his eyes, cried out, "SING IT AGAIN!" And they did. Over 150 years later, Americans still join in singing "Glory, Glory Hallelujah, His truth is marching on!" In the midst of a terrible Civil War, Ms. Howe proclaimed her confidence in God's triumphant power in this inspiring text. Happy Birthday to our Country that has been fought so hard for. I pray that the division in our Country today would diminish.

Do art projects together, ride bikes, paint with water or chalk on the sidewalk, pick berries, bake cookies, solve puzzles, sing songs!


